We lost in the floods our Vacuum cleaner, Gazebos, and many of our water cups were damaged or contaminated. We were able to obtain through Services NSW Grant replacement for these. The grant was obtained through Casino Poultry Club to simplify paperwork, so a thank you to them for this assistance.

As with 2020 we were unable to hold any shows due to the lack of power in the pavilion and other damage to the showgrounds generally. Our auction planned for May was also cancelled for the same reasons. Fortunately we were able to hold an auction in August which was very successful, bringing some of the highest prices at our auctions.

The North Coast National Show in October 2022 was also very successful. We were able to secure sponsorship for the Show from NORCO, with each exhibitor receiving a bag of feed and vouchers for Champion and Reserve Champion Bird of Show and Waterfowl. 



The Indian Game fowl reportedly gets its name from the 'Madras Fowls' brought to southern England from India for the entertainment of Cornish mining folk. Whether this is exactly correct is lost in the midst of time but certainly these fowls were crossed with the English Game fowls (presumably Black Red OEGs) to develop the Dark Indian Game we know today.

The first point to understanding any breed is to understand its purpose. The standard defines Indian Game as "Substance with Elegance'. With this in mind lets look at the original purpose of Indian game which was to have cockerels and yearling cock birds that could run with heavy breed large softfeather hens like Sussex to produce table birds with extraordinary muscling and meat yield. Today that same meat yield from Indian Game can be seen in commercial meat chickens.

In order to be fertile sires of meat birds, the Indian Game male was bred to be active and

fertile while

As breeders and fanciers worked to develop the Indian Game breed, another key attribute emerged, colour or more particularly lacing of females. This lacing has become a feature of the breed and the sight of clear 'embossed lacing' on a clean ground coloured female is a sight to behold. It is an endless challenge for breeders to breed perfect lacing without compromising the size or 'substance' which the breed is based.

Today we see mainly three colours of Indian Game recognized.

- Jubilee (Double White lacing on mahogany to nut brown ground colour)
- Blue Laced (Double Blue Lacing on mahogany to nut brown ground colour)
- Dark (Double Black lacing on mahogany to nut brown ground colour)







Other colours are under development and are seen from time to time along with a contentious effort to have self colours similar to the Cornish Game Fowls recognised in USA and other countries.

Further to this Indians are also found significantly in bantam form with the challenge being further than the large fowl of retaining the "Substance with Elegance" basis while reducing the size to a truly miniature of the large fowl. It is a challenge but certainly a number of great breeders have achieved this in Australia where arguably some of the best Indian Game bantams in the world have been bred, raised and shown over the past 50 years.

Indian game bantams are a really great dual purpose fowl for while they retain the meat production of their large fowl origins (read here the famed 'Cornish Hen' in culinary circles) but are also great layers of good sized tinted eggs. Very much worth consideration by those looking for a challenging breed that delivers very staisfactory options for culls!



Betty was recognized nationally as the author of the Indian Game edition of the 'Doyen' series, such was esteem with which she was held.

Many will remember Betty parked in her little station wagon right at the door of the Lismore pavilion on show day feverously monitoring the success of her Indians. I personally remember our many head to head battles in the showpen and Betty certainly was one heck of a competitor! She loved her Indians and sponsored an award "The Betty Wilcox Best Indian in Show' at her home club at Grafton. I will treasure our last meeting when I judged Grafton in 2022 and had time to chat again with Betty and discuss the state of the Indian Game breed in Australia.

Betty's other agricultural passion was preserved fruit and vegetables where she equally excelled. Her bottled preserves were a significant contributor to the success of the Northern District in the annual competition against other districts at the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW Show in Sydney each Easter. Absolute perfection was required and delivered with Betty's produce regularly the best in show and her skill was the envy of many other districts.

Finally, in a fancy often dominated by males, Betty was just like her Indian game bantams, 'Substance with Elegance'. Rest in peace Betty.
